**Westshore Recycling Announces Second Phase of Their Building Expansion as Complete**

Holland, MI-March 23, 2012- Chef Container, LLC is pleased to announce the completion of Phase II Expansion of the Westshore Recycling & Transfer Station.

The 6,000 sq. ft. metal structure that is connected to the original building will be home to a new recycling sorting system. The new processing equipment should be totally installed by the end of May 2012. With this construction completed, the combined expansion efforts have transformed the Westshore facility from a 6,400 sq. ft. single building to a combined 27,000 sq. ft. operation.

The Westshore Recycling & Transfer Station finished its phase I expansion which consisted of a towering 15,360 sq. ft. white tension fabric building from A. K. Equipment Inc. at the end of December 2011. This structure is being utilized as a bailing, storage and sorting area for inbound recycling materials collected by Chef Container and other recycling contractors throughout the State of Michigan.

Chef Container was originally founded in 2002 and was focused on providing advanced recycling within the solid waste marketplace. With the construction of the original Westshore Recycling & Transfer facility in 2004, Chef container, LLC was able to secure contracts with several municipalities to include: The City of Holland, The City of Saugatuck, The township of Laketown and The County of Allegan's recycling collection depots.
